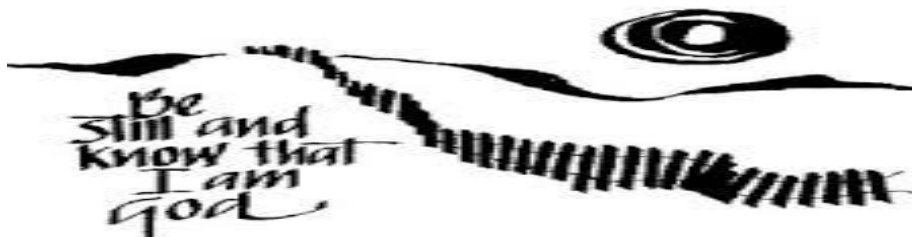

### General Synod's Shine! Festival features food, fun for all ages

If you are going to the United Church of Christ General Synod in June, you don't want to miss a chance to take in one of Milwaukee's mightiest ways of celebrating summer.

"Milwaukee is a city of outdoor festivals which we often call 'Fests,'" said the Rev. William Utke, pastor of Emanuel Church, Hales Corners, UCC, and one of the coordinators of the Sunday event. "From smaller neighborhood fests, to larger ethnic and musical festivals, the people of Milwaukee make the most of the outdoors through these celebration events. We hope to meet General Synod visitors at the UCC's Shine! Fest."

The Shine! Festival is slated for Sunday, June 23, from 4:30 - 8:30 pm in Milwaukee's Zeidler Union Square. Rev. Utke is planning the event with his wife Ann, who is serving as interim pastor, St. John's UCC, Random Lake, Wisconsin. The couple has developed a reputation as festivalgoers around town and are working now to line up both food and entertainment.

"Ann and I are very excited to offer this opportunity celebrating some of Milwaukee's diversity and the radical Wisconsin welcome we want the UCC delegates, staff members, special guests and visitors to experience," Bill Utke said.

The fun starts Sunday afternoon after the community worship service, just one block south of the convention center in Milwaukee's first park. More than a half-dozen food trucks will be parked around Zeidler Union Square, offering festival-goers a variety of local dining options. Beer, wine and other beverages will be available from [Milwaukee County Park](#) vendors.

As for entertainment, there will be live music on the gazebo stage featuring regional artists throughout the evening. From 5-6:30 pm, enjoy the sounds of [The Squeezettes](#), who honor Wisconsin's German heritage through their unique and raucous power polka, waltz, pop and rock tunes. The headline act, featuring members of the band [De La Buena](#), led by Cecilio Negrón Jr. of CNJ Latin Jazz, takes the stage from 7-8:30 p.m.

"Festivals have long been a major part of the cultural, social and economic fabric of Milwaukee," Bill Utke said. "Following the turmoil and rapid change of the post-war years, the 'City of Festivals' concept truly emerged, as the city leaders recognized the value of promoting unity, music and merriment for the community and its visitors. Our urban vitality is reflected in these events, such as the 11-day Summerfest, an attraction for over 50 years."

Attendance to the Shine! Fest is free and open to all. All ages are welcome. There will be a family game area, table space and tented areas located on the park grounds, as well as portable restrooms.

"Plan to grab a bite, stay a while, groove in your dancing shoes and enjoy this slice of the Wisconsin good life," Bill Utke said. "Come rain or shine, it's just a short stroll to a fun time."

### **Zion United Church of Christ Consistory Minutes - March 6, 2019**

The monthly meeting was called to order by President Vern Steffens at 7:00 p.m.

Members present: Vern Steffens, Deniece Carlson, Keith Henry, Tau Osa, Richard Hobaugh, Denise Tabb, and Pastor Erik Graefe.

Erik opened the meeting with a prayer.

Jill Schmutz reported the new five year copier lease was signed with no increase in the monthly charge; the Women of Joy Conference in Branson, Missouri, is coming up in October at a cost of \$109.00 per person plus travel to Branson plus meals; and the Seasons curriculum for Sunday school of all ages is available for \$958.00. On motion and second the copier lease was ratified. On motion and second the purchase of the Seasons curriculum was approved. Discussion of the Women of Joy Conference was tabled.

The minutes of the February 13, 2019, meeting were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report: February income was \$6,204.31; expenses were \$8,049.76, for a net monthly loss of \$1,845.45. The bank balance was \$38,866.25 on January 31, 2019, and \$37,020.80 on February 28, 2019. The report was accepted as submitted.

Pastor's Report: Visitations continue. Met with the Music Committee. Arranged for the purchase of a new communion cup and plate.

There were no other committee reports.

Old Business: KVK has finished the work on our boiler system and the bill has been paid as previously approved. Anson Jacobsen will handle the outside work again this summer without charge because he is accruing community service credits for graduation from high school. The Consistory discussed the need of the Open Door for donations.

New Business: Vern reported that the appraisal of the church property increased from \$696,500.00 for 2018 to \$705,830.00 for 2019. The Consistory discussed the purchase of a UCC yearbook for \$35.00. No action was taken.

The next meeting is April 3, 2019, at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

1. Listen to your body.
2. Listen to your body.
3. Drink water.

Take care of yourselves and don't be discouraged if you're not able to keep up with the prescribed run/walk schedule. Everyone should be disciplined in getting their workouts in but flexible in how they execute it. Need to walk more? Walk more.

Need a shorter session? Take a shorter session. Runners, you should be able to hold a conversation while you're running. If not, slow it down. If you can sing a song...then you need to step it up a bit and join choir! Remember we do NOT compare ourselves to other runners/walkers. Don't worry about what oth-

So today's class we talked about FAITH and ways we can build it.

What is FAITH?

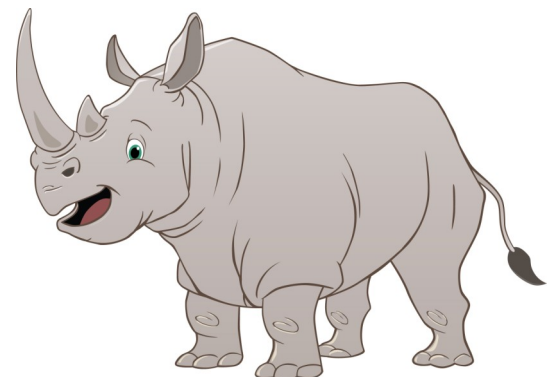
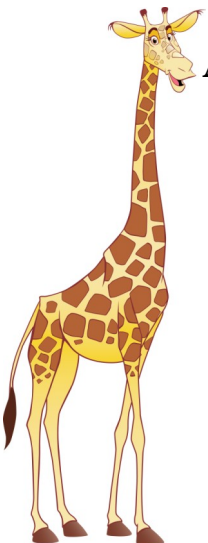
