So, I ran down to the vehicle and spent the next hour driving around my block, backing in and out of our driveway, and attempting to practice every conceivable scenario of which I could dream with respect to driving a truck while pulling a good sized, double-axle trailer through Lawrence, Kansas.

The trip didn't go too badly. I only had to back up one time, and the person waiting for me turned out to be patient and kind. I relate the story not to celebrate my new skills as a driver, but to remind us of the opportunities right in front of us everyday to not simply read about, learn about, even confess aloud about, but to actually *be* the eyes, hands, feet, and body of the risen Christ. We have had all the instruction we need. We know how to love our neighbor, we know how to stand with the poor in spirit, we know how to love our enemies. We don't need more youtube videos to inspire us. All that is left is to *do* it. We will have trouble, we will have missteps, but what matters is our heart's intention.
